



Mobile Solar in Cuba

How many solar panels are there in Cuba? This greatly underdeveloped energy source is slowly making its way across the island: there are currently more than 6,000 photovoltaic panels and 1,500 solar heaters in use. The installed solar energy generating capacity in Cuba is around 3 megawatts, or 0.07 % of the total installed capacity. Will Cuba get more solar energy by ? About 95 percent of Cuba's electricity generation relies on fossil fuels, which include the natural gas produced with domestic oil, offshore oil rigs leased from Turkey, as well as diesel and fuel oil based generators and engines. How much electricity does Cuba consume a month? According to official figures, around six percent of the more than four million households in Cuba consume more than 500 kilowatt hours (kWh) per month.
